(Adapted from Dutch monastic rule for a new brother 1973 Benedictine Priory, 'Regina Pacis')

Following Jesus does not mean slavishly copying His life. It means making his choice of life our own, Starting from our own potential, and in the place we find ourselves Lord Jesus, help us to follow.

It means living for the values for which Jesus lived and died. It means following the path He took And seeing things as He saw them. Lord Jesus, open our eyes to see

If there is anything in which this life, this way, can be expressed, In which God has revealed Himself most clearly, It is the reality of love. What love is we can learn from Jesus. Lord Jesus, teach us to love.

Those wishing to become Members of Common Ground

Q. Those wishing to become Members of Common Ground undertake , for such a period as they feel called and committed, to pray together, build community together, live as far as they are able by the 4 Promises and to participate together in the missional activity of Common Ground. Do you wish to become a member of the Common Ground Community for Mission?

A. I do

Q. Will you continue in fellowship in your home church, whilst also continuing to grow in your discipleship and service through Common Ground?

A. I will.

Q. Are you willing, as God enables you, to embrace and live out the Four Promises of the Common Ground Way of Life:

A. We promise before God , and seeking his help, and in the presence of our brothers and sisters gathered here:

TO PRAY – daily, individually, and with others, for Guildford, for the world, and for Common Ground, its members and ministries.

TO MEET & SHARE TOGETHER – in the community meetings for prayer, friendship and learning

TO GO TOGETHER – working with others to offer the Christian Faith in new ways to the people of our town.

TO GIVE – through finance, and the offering of our gifts of creativity, skills and time.

Those wishing to become Companions of Common Ground

Q. Companions of Common Ground are committed to the vision of the Community but are unable to commit fully to share in its pattern of life. They undertake to pray and to participate as they are able to fulfil the aims and goals of the community. Do you wish to become an Associate of Common Ground?

A. I do.

Q. Are you willing to support the Common Ground Community in prayer, in encouragement, and in action as you are able, living out in your context the central vision and promises of Common Ground:

TO PRAY DAILY TO MEET WITH OTHERS TO BUILD CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY TO GO WITH OTHERS IN MISSION

A. We wish to live out in our context the vision and values of Common Ground and to support and participate in the activities of the Common Ground Community as we are able.

Those wishing to become Friends of Common Ground

Q. Friends of Common Ground may live at a distance, or for a variety of reasons be unable to participate directly. They undertake to pray for, to promote the work of the Community and to share in it when opportunity may arise. Do you wish to become a Friend of Common Ground?

A. I do

<u>To all making commitments to Common Ground today, and all gathered:</u> As we make these promises before God and with and before our sisters and brothers, we pray:

May Christ , as a light illumine and guide us. May Christ, as a shield Overshadow us. Christ under us; Christ over us; Christ beside us on our left and on our right. May Christ be in the heart of all to whom we speak; In the mouth of all who speak to us. Christ as a light; Christ as a shield: Christ beside us On our left and our right. AMEN

THE OFFERING OF OUR PROMISES

- The Promise cards are brought to a local church leader who receives them on behalf of the churches of Guildford,
- He asks God's blessing on the Common Ground Community and its ministry for the town, and the promises that have been made today.
- The local leader blesses the congregation.

SONG:

Will you come and follow me if I but call your name? Will you go where you don't know, And never be the same? Will you let my love be shown, will you let my name be known, will you let my life be grown in and you in me.
